The students performed excellently with 11 students making it through to the State Championships. **Mason Selder** won a gold medal in the 10yo 100m Hurdles leaving his opponents for dead and winning the race by 15 metres. **Melissa Diggerman** jumped a massive 7.66m in Triple Jump to win a gold medal as well. **Bella Grimley** won a silver medal in Shot Put and has now made it to the State finals 3 years in a row for Shot Put. The Boys 12yo 4x100 and the Girls 11yo 4x100 relay teams won silver medals and have also made it through to the State finals. **Tom Hanily, Xavier Bolge** and **Rylie Checkley** have been part of the relay team that has made it to the State finals 3 years in a row. **Hudson Martin** is the fourth member of the team and it is his first time making it to the State finals. The rest of the students battled hard in the heat all day and showed strength and determination to do their best despite the trying conditions. A big thank you needs to go to the parents that took time off work to drive the students out to Newborough and assist where needed on the day. These days can't run without these sorts of volunteers.


